By receiving the Holy Spirit, you are bound to the church in a more complete way. (CCC #1285) To quote a great superhero "With great power comes great responsibility." When you say yes to being Confirmed you are saying you will be a faithful Catholic, by attending mass, going to frequent confession, praying regularly, evangelizing the faith, and treating others as Christ did with love and forgiveness.

Confirmation Name


The selecting of a confirmation name is a tradition that dates back to the 3rd or 4th century. It was based off the tradition of many great biblical figures receiving a new name at the start of their ministry such as Abram who became Abraham, Simon who became Peter, Saul who became Paul. In the tradition, a person would choose a saint to be their patron or chosen saint. It would be someone they deeply admired and felt a connection to. They also would pray (talk to that saint) asking for their chosen saint's intercession every day. The saint's feast day would now become a special day and be celebrated as much or more than the person's birthday.


The Archdiocese of Baltimore does not require a selection of a saint name, but does say it is a worthy practice, and if a candidate would like to select a saint name they may. If they do not select a saint name, they should use their baptismal name (birth name). The saint's name is recorded along with the date of Confirmation Mass

- -Talk about your retreat experience.
- -How has your sponsor influenced you through this journey?

Your completed letter should be given to your small group leader.

- -must be typed, 12pt font
- -keep it to one page
- -start your letter with "Dear Bishop Parker" or "Your Excellency"
- -we are Catholic (uppercase "C")
- -we believe in God (uppercase "G")
- -when referring to God He, Him should be capitalized
- -you are being confirmed (not conformed)
- -adoration is correct spelling

Take your time and put some effort into this. Review your letter for grammar and spelling errors. Your small group leader will help- just ask! The Bishop will actually read your letter and remember most of the letters- and who wrote each one. He is known for talking with confirmandi prior to the confirmation mass about their letters.

Retreat

Where are we going? We will be staying at <u>River Valley Ranch</u> in Manchester, MD. You are responsible for dropping your teen at RVR and picking them up after the retreat.

What time do I need to drop my teenager off and pick them up? We are asking that teens with the last name A-L are dropped off at RVR between 5:00 -5:25 pm and teens with the last name M-Z are dropped off 5:25 - 5:50 pm. This is a request as I am sure some of these times might be challenging for certain work schedules. However, a staggered arrival time we believe will help make this process much easier (and faster!) for everyone involved. We ask that you drop your teen off at the "Rodeo Arena" (see map on the next page). We also encourage you to carpool to reduce the traffic on the campus. If there is rain, we will change drop off and pick up area to the Buffalo Lodge. I will send out an email on the Thursday prior with any updates.

Pick Up on Sunday will be at 11:30 am.

At the drop off, we also ask you to drop off any donations from the Sign-up Genius or monetary donations to offset the costs for our service projects

Paperwork: There are two forms your family needs to complete for this retreat. Please see the email for the links!

Medicine: If your teen has any medicine, you need them to have for the weekend, we will need you to check this medicine in with our medical team. We are blessed to have a Mike Johnson (who is a paramedic) that at will be managing our medical needs for the weekend. In addition to handing the medicine to our medical team, we will need you to fill out the included form (see the email). We encourage you to bring this form with you printed and filled out to the check-in to speed up your drop off time.

Who will be Going on this retreat? Your teen's small group leader for Purpose and Life Teen leaders. In addition to those outside of the Purpose Program, we will have some other adults from our LIFE TEEN CORE team (high school youth ministry) and our parish school attending to help chaperone this event.

Where will my teen be staying? We will be staying in the dormitories on RVR's campus. We do not know which dorms we will be in yet. I will notify you when I have that information. Boys and girls are housed in separate buildings.

What is the Policy on Phones? Cell phones are not permitted for confirmation students attending the retreat, as is the policy with Carroll County Outdoor education. Unfortunately, phones create more problems than they solve on a retreat and provide a constant distraction for our students at times we want them to be interacting in their small groups, praying or trying to go to bed. We also understand that we live in a world that is full of chaos, and it can be disconcerting to be out of touch from your teenager for a weekend. We will provide you with the contact for your teen's small group leader the week prior to retreat so you can be in touch with your teen to check in on them. You are also free to contact Kenn deMoll (retreat director) directly at 240-409-3657. RVR's office line is 443-712-1010 (someone may not always be there)

What will my teen be doing? We have attached our current schedule. We ask that you please do not share information with your teen as a big part of a retreat experience is disconnecting from our over scheduled lives. Your teen will get the chance to experience keynote talks, small group sessions (with their weekly small group), prayer time, sacramental experiences (Reconciliation, Mass and Eucharistic Adoration), games, music and more.



4. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.

Have I missed Mass on Sunday because of sports or another activity? Do I rest on Sunday and spend time with my family or praying, or am I busy doing homework?

5. Honor your father and mother.

Have I ever spoken unkindly about my parents? Have I yelled angrily at them? Willfully disobeyed them or lied to them? Have I been disobedient to those in authority over me? Teachers? Coaches? Law enforcement? Core Members?

6. You shall not murder.

Have I killed someone's reputation through lies and slander? Have I manipulated situations or people to hurt another? Have I gotten angry or held grudges and resentments? Have I refused to forgive others? Have I cultivated hatred? Have I mocked or made fun of another? Have I supported abortions? Have I advocated for euthanasia or the death penalty? Have I sped or texted while driving? Have I gotten drunk or taken drugs?

7. You shall not commit adultery.

Have I looked lustfully at others? Have I lustfully kissed or sexually touched someone? Have I visited pornographic websites? Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage?

8. You shall not steal.

Have I stolen media off the Internet? Downloaded music, movies, or tv shows? Have I shoplifted? Have I wasted something that belonged to another?

9. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

10. You shall not covet.

Ezekiel 37:1-10

The hand of the LORD came upon me, and he led me out in the spirit of the LORD and set me in the center of the broad valley. It was filled with bones.

Godfather: light a candle and stand next to the baby.

Priest: says, "Parents and Godparents, this light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly so that your child, enlightened by Christ, may walk always as a child of the light."

After the role-play has ended, have everyone switch roles. The goal is for everyone to have a turn as the priest and pretend to baptize the baby.

Renewal of Baptismal Vows

Dim the lights in your room, re-light one of the candles and place the Holy Water within the circle. Explain to the small group that you are inviting them to renew their baptismal promises. The reason we renew our promises throughout the year is to remind ourselves what we believe and how we are called to live. They should answer each question with a firm "I do."

Small Group leader: If your faith makes you ready to renew your responsibility, then, mindful of your own Baptism, renounce sin and profess faith in Christ Jesus, the faith of the Church, in which you were baptized:

- Do you renounce sin, so as to live in the freedom of the children of God?
- Do you renounce the lure of evil, so that sin may have no mastery over you?
- Do you renounce Satan, the author and prince of sin?
- Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth?
- Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?
- Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

Small Group leader: This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus our Lord.

All: Amen.

After renewing their promises, invite the teens to come forward and sign themselves with Holy Water.

Close the renewal by praying the Our Father together.

Confirmation Roleplay

Step 1: Renewal of Your Baptismal Vows. Remind the teens that Confirmation is a verification of their Baptism. So, the first step is to renew their Baptismal promises. This is what we did last week:

Bishop: Do you renounce Satan, and all his works, and all his empty promises? Confirmandi: I do.

Bishop: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth? Confirmandi: I do.

Bishop: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

Confirmandi: I do.

Bishop: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who today through the Sacrament of Confirmation is given to you in a special way just as he was given to the Apostles on the day of Pentecost? Confirmandi: I do.

Bishop: Do you believe in the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

Confirmandi: I do.

Bishop: This is our faith. This is the faith of the church. We are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus our Lord. Confirmandi: Amen.

Step 2: Anointing and Laying on of Hands

Next have the teens lined up to be anointed by the Bishop. The Bishop anoints the forehead with "chrism" saying:

Bishop: X, be sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit."

Newly Confirmed: Amen.

Bishop: Peace be with you.

Newly Confirmed: And with your spirit

Confirmation in Scripture

The Holy Spirit Comes at Pentecost Acts 2:1-12

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues^[a] as the Spirit enabled them.

⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ^[1] 10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

Peter Addresses the Crowd Acts 2: 1-14, 17-21, 25-28, 41

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd:

¹⁷ "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people.
